U.S. Bishops Conduct Canonical Consultation on Cause for Canonization of Sr. Thea Bowman, F.S.P.A.

November 14, 2018. BALTIMORE— at their annual fall Plenary Assembly in Baltimore, MD, the U.S Bishops participated in a consultation on the cause for sainthood of the Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman, F.S.P.A. Bishop Robert P. Deeley, Chairman of the Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance, and Bishop Joseph R. Kopacz, Bishop of Jackson, Mississippi, the petitioner of the cause, facilitated the discussion. By a voice vote, the bishops indicated unanimous support for the advancement of the cause on the diocesan level. A self-proclaimed, “old folks’ child,” Bowman, was the only child born to middle-aged parents, Dr. Theon Bowman, a physician and Mary Esther Bowman, a teacher. At birth she was given the name Bertha Elizabeth Bowman. She was born in 1937 and reared in Canton, Mississippi. As a child she converted to Catholicism through the inspiration of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration and the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity who were her teachers and pastors at Holy Child Jesus Church and School in Canton.

At an early age, Thea was exposed to the richness of her African-American culture and spirituality, most especially the history, stories, songs, prayers, customs and traditions. At the age of fifteen, she told her parents and friends she wanted to join the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration and left the familiar Mississippi terrain to venture to the unfamiliar town of LaCrosse, Wisconsin where she would be the only African-American member of her religious community. At her religious profession, she was given the name, “Sister Mary Thea” in honor of the Blessed Mother and her father, Theon. Her name in religious life, Thea, literally means “God.” She was trained to become a teacher. She taught at all grade levels, eventually earning her doctorate and becoming a college professor of English and linguistics.

In 1984, Sister Thea faced devastating challenges: both her parents died, and she was diagnosed with breast cancer. Sister Thea vowed to “live until I die” and continued her rigorous schedule of speaking engagements. Even when it became increasingly painful and difficult to travel as the cancer metastasized to her bones, she was undeterred from witnessing and sharing her boundless love for God and the joy of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Donned in her customary African garb, Sister Thea would arrive in a wheel chair with no hair (due to the chemotherapy treatments) but always with her a joyful disposition and pleasant smile. She did not let the deterioration of her body keep her from one unprecedented event, an opportunity to address the U.S. Bishops at their annual June meeting held in 1989 at Seton Hall University in East Orange, NJ.

She explained what it meant to be African-American and Catholic. She enlightened the bishops on African-American history and spirituality. Sister Thea urged the bishops to continue to evangelize the African-American community, to promote inclusivity and full participation of African-Americans within Church leadership, and to understand the necessity and value of Catholic schools in the African-American community. At the end of her address, she invited the bishops to move together, cross arms and sing with her, “We Shall Overcome.” She seemingly touched the hearts of the bishops as evidenced by their thunderous applause and tears flowing from their eyes. During her short lifetime (52 years), many people considered her a religious Sister undeniably close to God and who lovingly invited others to encounter the presence of God in their lives. She is acclaimed a “holy woman” in the hearts of those who knew and loved her and continue to seek her intercession for guidance and healing. Today across the United States there are schools; an education foundation to assist needy students to attend Catholic universities; housing units for the poor and elderly, and a health clinic for the marginalized named in her honor. Books, articles, catechetical resources, visual media productions, a stage play, have been written documenting her exemplary life. Prayer cards, works of art, statues, and stained-glass windows bearing her image all attest to Sister Thea’s profound spiritual impact and example of holiness for the faithful.

LIVE WITH A *grateful* HEART

Por qué se celebra el Día de Acción de Gracias en Estados Unidos?

El día de Acción de Gracias es una de las festividades más importantes en Estados Unidos, pero ¿por qué celebran este día los estadounidenses? En Estados Unidos y Canadá se celebra *Thanksgiving* o Acción de Gracias pero en diferentes fechas. En suelo estadounidense se festeja el cuarto jueves de noviembre y en territorio canadiense, el segundo lunes de octubre. Su importancia ha trascendido a otros países, sin embargo muy pocos conocen el origen de esta celebración. La tradición en Estados Unidos surgió en 1621 cuando un grupo de colonos de Plymouth, actual estado de Massachusetts, compartieron una comida con los indios wampanoag para celebrar la cosecha del otoño y agradecerles que les hubieran enseñado técnicas de cultivo y caza.

Los indios llevaron carne de ciervo para ser asada y pavos, mientras que los colonos habían aprendido cómo cocinar los arándanos y prepararon las diferentes clases de grano sobre vajillas desconocidas para los indígenas. Este primer día de Acción de Gracias de la historia duró tres días, y sería uno de los pocos ejemplos de armonía entre los colonos europeos y los nativos americanos. Sin embargo, no fue hasta 1863, en medio de la Guerra Civil, cuando el presidente Abraham Lincoln proclamó Acción de Gracias como un día festivo a nivel nacional, el cual se celebraría el último jueves de noviembre. En esta proclamación tuvo mucho que ver la figura de Sarah Josepha Hale, una peregrina que fue quien realmente convenció a Lincoln de establecer un día de "acción de gracias" para restablecer al país de la devastadora guerra.

La fiesta no se establece de manera oficial por el Congreso hasta 1941, año en el que el presidente Franklin D. Roosevelt, proclama como festivo el día de Acción de Gracias. La celebración de Acción de Gracias ha evolucionado, aunque el origen de compartir bendiciones y buenos deseos con la familia y los seres más cercanos se mantiene. Lo tradicional es dar gracias por todo lo bueno que tienen y piden bendiciones juntos para los suyos. El plato emblemático del Día de Acción de Gracias es pavo asado u horneado, que generalmente va acompañado de ensalada y un relleno en base a pan, maíz y salvia. El origen de la utilización del pavo como platillo principal se desconoce, aunque se sabe que es una especie nativa de América. También se preparan pasteles y se comen diversas frutas, principalmente, manzanas.

Una de las tradiciones de este día es el indulto que da el Presidente a uno de los dos pavos que se servirían en la cena de la Casa Blanca. En Manhattan, Nueva York, una cadena de tiendas por departamento organiza un colorido desfile callejero que atrae a millones de personas, entre turistas y estadounidenses. Durante el Día de Acción de Gracias, las tiendas, bancos, comercios y grandes cadenas permanecen cerrados. Al día siguiente se lleva a cabo el tradicional "Viernes Negro", donde los ciudadanos salen desde muy temprano de sus casas para ir a los negocios a comprar cosas en oferta.

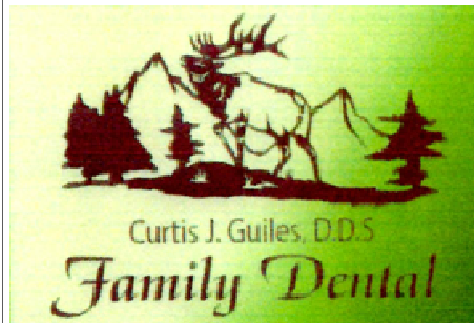
